Dear Sir:

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated July 21, 1947, addressed to Mr. A. S. SARKIS, 66 North Lane Avenue, Hockville, Long Island, New York, a copy of which was sent to the New York Office.

Mrs. SARKIS was interviewed by Special Agent William A. Johnson on August 12, 1947. At which time she advised that this good message had appeared in "Newday", the local newspaper of Nassau and Suffolk County, Long Island, New York. She stated that the message had appeared in the "County Incident", a feature of this paper, and had been signed "Radio Man".

Mr. JACK ALTSCHUL, City Editor of "Newday", Hempstead, New York, was interviewed and advised that this article had been sent to the newspaper by letter which was signed "Radio Man", and explained that he had no way of determining the identity of the writer. Mr. ALTSCHUL stated that it was his opinion that the name had been made up by some local "scrawaller" who had been affected by all of the newspaper publicity that had been given at that time to the story about "Radio Man".

There is enclosed an article appearing in the July 1947 issue of "Newday" concerning this good message, which might be of interest in this matter.

Unless advised to the contrary, no further effort is being made to establish the identity of the person who signed himself "Radio Man".
