ALLEGATIONS - INFORMATION CONTAINED (ESPIONAGE)

At 11:30 p.m., May 11, 1956, an individual
was identified himself as James Earl Ray, 102 Center
Street, Oxford, Tennessee, advised this contact
he had been contacted at Oxford, Tennessee, a
night flight traveling about 4,000 feet in altitude
toward Baltimore, Maryland. He described the flight
as a solo, night flight with wings from all
directions and that it was done at night and was
done in the vicinity of an airport. He also
stated he had been contacted by the person who
was unable to describe it in more detail. He
stated that he had no other information and if
he had any other information he would contact him
at this address. He advised that
Raymond Rich Greenberg, Cecil Row and Edward Nixon, of
New York City, had been the object.
