Department of the Air Force had been furnished a copy of
his letter to the President.

Mr. TERRY was advised that the FBI was taking no
investigative action in this matter and he said he was
fully aware of the Bureau's policies in matters of this
nature.

Mr. TERRY expressed his appreciation for the
cooperation of the FBI.
